If you're not quite sure what a laboratory research scientist (LRS) is, then that's because at the Crick we have a new job title to go with our shiny new institute. At other research institutes, technically skilled staff have many other job titles, including scientific officer, research assistant, research technician and scientific manager.

At the Crick, LRS are found in <u>research labs</u> and in the <u>science technology</u> <u>platforms (STPs)</u>, our in-house expert facilities. Together we have formed the <u>LRS Network</u> to share information, expertise and good practice, as well as to promote visibility and recognition of our important scientific role.

Visibility and recognition are also two of the aims of <u>Technician Commitment</u> (TC), which the <u>Crick signed up to</u> in 2017. A TC initiative, the <u>Research Institutes Technician Symposium</u> (<u>RITS 2019</u>), recently brought together delegates from a network of six research institutes, the Crick, MRC Harwell, the Wellcome Trust Sanger Institute, the John Innes Centre, the Babraham Institute and the Institute for Cancer Research (ICR), to explore issues of career development and promoting professional identity.

These issues are highly relevant to LRSs at the Crick and equivalent staff at other institutes.
